

FCM Safety Team. Here at First Church, safety is a top priority. It is even part of our statement of faith: "We will provide a safe haven - physically, emotionally, and spiritually - for all those whom God sends us." As such, the Church Council is developing a safety team, and we are seeking folks interested in serving on this team. Free Concert. Today at 3 p.m. the Jazz Bones, under the direction of David Neill, will perform at First Church. The ensemble consists of four tenor trombones, one bass trombone, guitar, bass, and drums. The concert is free and open to the public. It is sponsored by the First Church Music Committee and the Monson Cultural Council, a local agency which is supported by the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency.

Guidelines for Announcements during Worship Service.

Church Council hopes to streamline the announcement process during the Sunday worship service. Announcements should be printed in the bulletin whenever possible. If you want to make an oral announcement, please follow these guidelines.

- 1. Give Pastor Holly a short, clearly written announcement for her to read.
- 2. Sit in the first row near the lectern if you wish to be recognized during announcement time.
- 3. Write out your announcement so that you can deliver it succinctly.


A Switch from Carrots to Salads in Loaves and Fishes Program. For the past seven months, we have been serving cooked carrots as the side dish to the lasagna or chicken & rice casseroles that we prepare and take to South Congregational Church in Springfield to share with anyone in need of a meal. This is done on the second Monday of every month.

During the months of May through September we prepare and serve a tossed green salad instead of carrots. Preparing a salad consists of filling a gallon zip-lock style container with mixed greens along with a couple of tomatoes and a cucumber and placing them in the church refrigerator on the Sunday before we go down to Springfield to serve. There is also the option of contributing \$6 for the purchase of salad ingredients — a great option when working around vacations or a busy schedule.

You can also be involved by helping to transport the food to South Congregational Church and assisting to serve the meal.
