Fifty days after Jesus' resurrection, on a day called Pente-cost, the Christian church was born. Because Pentecost was a holiday celebrating the harvest (a bit like our Thanksgiving), the apostles and a large crowd had gathered to celebrate in Jerusalem.

Many people had assembled near Peter and the other followers of Christ when "[F]rom heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind ... " (Acts 2:2 ff, NRSV). Then tongues of fire descended on everyone in the crowd.

After the wind and fire descended, all sorts of languages, known and unknown, came out of the crowd. Each person spoke "about God's deeds of power" (verse 11). No wonder Luke wrote, "All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?'" (verse 12).

The whole affair was mind-boggling and life-changing. The Holy Spirit had come upon many people; they knew God was powerfully at work in their midst.

On Pentecost many years ago, some 3,000 people came to believe in Christ. That's why today Christians remember this powerful event as the birthday of the church. Pentecost occurs on June 8 this year.


Treble Makers Character Dinner and Concert Saturday, May 17, 2025

New members David and Dylan have been a dynamic addition to the Board of Trustees. With their fresh ideas and energy, the trustees are hoping to accomplish many improvements to the church this year. I will keep the congregation posted through a regular article in *The Messenger*.

Boilers. The three boilers that heat the church are nearing the end of their useful life. Dylan is working with BG Mechanical to keep them going as long as possible. The trustees hope to have a Mass Save inspection that will provide recommendations and grant money for an upgraded system.

Steeple Leak. Tony saved First Church thousands of dollars last fall by caulking an area in the steeple that was allowing water to enter the church during rainstorms with high winds. He hopes to do some additional caulking this spring.

Thermostats. Chris sets the temperature for each church event manually at the start of the week or whenever plans change. For years the trustees have tried to find reasonably priced thermostats that can be controlled remotely and will work with our wiring. Perhaps this is the year this will happen.

Outdoor Lighting. The lights in the parking lot and on our property on High Street cost us \$350/month for electricity. After months of nagging National Grid, Chris has succeeded in getting the bulbs changed to LEDs. The new white light should result in a much lower electricity bill and better visibility at night.

Ramp Door. Despite David's replacing the weather-stripping, the entrance door at the top of the ramp still does not work properly. Several trustees are using their connections to see about replacing this door with a proper commercial door.

Church Sign. Letting those who drive by First Church know who we are is important. The trustees are investing in a taller, beautiful, two-sided sign to replace the worn sign on the south lawn near the monument. Gary and I are working with Agnoli Sign to have this installed in the near future. Gary will then freshen the landscaping near the sign.

A Switch from Carrots to Salads in Loaves and Fishes Program



For the past seven months, we have prepared and served cooked carrots as a side dish to either the lasagna or chicken and rice casseroles that we prepare and take them to South Congregational Church in Springfield to share with anyone in need of a meal.

For the upcoming five months (May through September) we will serve a tossed green salad instead of carrots. Preparing a salad consists of filling a gallon zip-lock style container with mixed greens along with a couple of tomatoes and a cucumber and placing them in the church refrigerator on the Sunday before we go down to Springfield to serve. There is also the option of contributing \$6 for the purchase of salad ingredients, a great option when working around vacations or a busy schedule.

You can also be involved by helping to transport the food to South Congregational Church in Springfield on the second Monday of the month and assist in serving the meal. The Restoration of the Swell Division of the Johnson Organ is complete. The organ has been tuned to perfection. The reeds are especially bright and in fine use for the triumphant music of the Easter season. A celebration concert featuring Robert Greene will be held on September 13, 2025. This concert is being underwritten by the Monson Cultural Council.

A second concert will be held on Saturday, October 25. Peter Krasinski will bring his famous improvisational skills to accompany the silent film

"Cinderella." Once again, our sincere gratitude goes to the town of Monson for supporting the upkeep of our historic organ.

In just a few short weeks, we will be hosting an important electronic recycling program in partnership with Green Day Recycling.


